# Maintenance

On green course, target 8, the walk away behind the bear has been removed, you are now required to walk to the right.

### **Southern Water**

Southern Water are looking for a place to lay a new pipe. One of the proposed plans sees the pipe going through the woods. It is not at the consultation stage yet, and they are considering alternative routes. The ecologist who was sent out for a survey is under the impression they will avoid the woods, due to the expense of tree removal, while this is not certain, it is reassuring to hear.

# **Theft and Flytipping**
